

File Transfer Protocol MACINTOSH

The following are instructions for using a FTP client or a Web Browser.

It is unfortunate that Internet Browsers on a Macintosh will not allow you to “put” files on the ftp server but will allow downloads.

Macintosh users have a choice of FTP Client software available, some of which is Freeware and others require a purchase. The following is a list of some possible FTP Clients for MAC. MASI does not recommend any particular piece of software.

If you are using an Internet browser to download files from our FTP server on a Macintosh, use the following URL.

(NOTE: exchange is the user name and private is the password.

If you are using FTP Client software, they will need the following information.

Server: <ftp2.multi-ad.com>

User Name: exchange

Password: private

File Transfer Protocol PC

Unlike a Macintosh, PC users have the ability to Upload/Download files with the Internet Browser. If you are using an Internet browser to upload/download files from our FTP server on a PC, use the following URL.

<ftp://exchange:private@ftp2.multi-ad.com>

(NOTE: exchange is the user name and private is the password. These can change, and if they do, it will be necessary to change them before sending instructions.)

If the user has FTP Client software, they will need the following information.

Server: <ftp2.multi-ad.com>

User Name: exchange

Password: private
